Keynote Speaker



CYRIL JEFFERSON

Cyril Jefferson is a husband, father, and awardwinning social innovator whose life has been dedicated to impacting others, creating opportunities, and mobilizing resources for social change. As Founder & Principal at Change Often - Social Innovation Firm, Cyril leads the company's Innovation BrainTrust in solving social and economic challenges through collaborative solutions and comprehensive capacity building services. Working in spaces where the bottom line prioritizes "lives saved over dollars" made," the Change Often team helps bring to life the ideas that impact our world for the good and has partnered to invest more than \$22M in impact initiatives for small business support, poverty alleviation, and education. Though he has received numerous honors—including a National Distinguished Service Award and being named to a Hunt State Policy Fellowship—the greatest to date came when voters in the 2023 High Point City Elections made him the youngest person to ever be elected Mayor of High Point, North Carolina. Mayor Jefferson is a graduate of North Carolina A&T State University. Living the words of Winston Churchill, he and his wife, Raven, teach their two sons that "To improve is to change. To perfect is to change often."





ALEXIS FRANZESE

Alexis Franzese is the Department Chair and an Associate Professor for the Department of Sociology and Anthropology at Elon University. She also maintains a small private therapy practice and does wellness workshops and coaching, with a focus on happiness and authenticity (www.authenticAF.me). With academic training in the fields of sociology and psychology, her teaching and research interests are at the intersection of these fields and her main area of inquiry is on issues of self, identity, and well-being. She is especially passionate about her study of authenticity-being one's true self and is currently conducting research on authenticity and identity within travel and tourism, with Disney as a strategic domain of focus. In addition to publications within edited volumes and other peer-reviewed collections, her research has been published in journals that span the breadth of her scholarly interests and include International Journal of Scholarship on Teaching and Learning, Personality and Individual Differences, Sociology Compass, Aging and Mental Health, and others. She is a graduate of Union College (B.A.) and Duke University where she completed two separate doctoral degrees, in sociology and in psychology (clinical). She loves teaching others about the science of happiness and tries to incorporate her knowledge into her own full life and adventures with her four children, two dogs, and a very curious cat.





CECELIA THOMPSON

Cecelia Thompson serves as Executive Director of Action Greensboro, Action Greensboro, together with the Chamber of Commerce, serves as the city's primary economic and community development agency. Formed in 2001, Action Greensboro is a collaborative effort of eight local charitable foundations working to leverage local philanthropic impact. In collaboration with business, higher education, and municipal government, Action Greensboro works to strengthen Greensboro's economy and ensure the continuation of its excellent quality of life. In her role, Thompson leads a variety of efforts from talent and workforce development, K-20 education, urban livability, advocacy campaigns and city marketing efforts. In addition to her role at Action Greensboro, Thompson serves on the boards of the Guilford Education Alliance, the North Carolina Early Childhood Foundation, and is a gubernatorial appointee to the North Carolina Humanities Council. Originally from Gainesville, Florida, Thompson holds a B.A. in Political Science, Public Administration and Sociology from Elon University.



CELINA MCCREA

Celina is a seasoned community engagement professional with a strong track record in building strategic partnerships that connect job seekers to meaningful careers. With extensive experience as a case manager and a Bachelor's degree in Public Relations from SUNY Fredonia, Celina leverages her communication skills to drive impactful change in workforce development. In 2023, she was awarded the Rookie of the Year at Goodwill Industries of Central North Carolina, where she currently works as the Community & Business Engagement Manager. Joey Cheek is the EVP of Entrepreneurship for the Greensboro Chamber of Commerce, tasked with growing the startup community and helping to launch venture scalable businesses. Previously, Cheek spent 10 years on the US National Speedskating Team where he competed in two Olympic Games winning gold, silver, and bronze medals. He attended Princeton University before diving into the startup and tech world. He launched a livestreaming platform for sports before leading a team of engineers building next-gen news and content apps for Fortune 100 companies. Before taking his role at the Chamber, Cheek worked in venture capital as the CEO and co-founder of SmartSolar.org. He is a member of the US Speedskating Hall of Fame, the Guilford County Sports Hall of Fame, the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame, and the World Sports Humanitarian Hall of Fame. He won the inaugural Heisman Humanitarian Award for his work advocating for civilians from Darfur, Sudan.

Her award-winning research examines ethical violations, leadership missteps, and trust breaches in organizational settings, with a particular focus on how transgressions—such as abusive supervision, workplace deviance, and organizational betrayal—affect culture and employee well-being. She has developed influential models for understanding apology, reconciliation, and moral decisionmaking, and her work has been recognized for its impact on advancing leadership and ethics scholarship. Separately, in her consulting practice, Dr. Stackhouse partners with organizations to develop strategic leadership capabilities, improve relational effectiveness across generations, and integrate Gen Z talent into high-performing teams. Known for translating rigorous research into actionable strategies, she equips leaders to foster resilient, ethical, and engaged workplaces.





MARIA HICKS-FEW

Maria started her career with the City in 1994 as a specialist in the Human Resources Department. After a 14-year stint in private industry, she rejoined the City in 2014 as its first Inclusion and Engagement Officer.
